

Summer months are a challenge for rural women, where they need to traverse hot and rugged pathways to bring home drinking water. This ergonomically designed device is aimed to reduce this staggering headload that results in harmful health consequences for rural women.

Reducing head load for the homemakers

Frail and tired women, especially middle and old aged, carrying pots full of water is a common sight in the Indian rural areas. Decades of exposure to such kind of laborious work, results in straining of the neck and



shoulder muscles, leading to long-term health complications like slip disk, vertigo, dislocation of shoulder joints and many more. There does not seem to be a cost-effective solution for the issue, given that bicycles and motorcycles entail sizeable investments for purchase, fuel and maintenance. Shri Khimjibhai Kanadia, had different ideas. He has invented a low cost and simple head gear that can be worn by people to shift the load from head to the shoulders and vice versa.



The innovation is a boon to women who need to carry loads for more than ten to twenty miles, from wells and springs to their households. The device has a headrest where the load will be stationed, along with two extending support rods that originate from the sides of the head rest. The weight is effortlessly transferred to the shoulders. When Khimjibhai developed the concept, he did not make much progress since his neighbors and friends did not take the idea seriously.
